

MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN & THE CHAIR OF THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

It is a great privilege to be entrusted with the care of Winchester Cathedral. This year the Coronavirus pandemic has swept the world and affected each one of us in many ways.
