The season of remembrance which began yesterday with All Saints' Day continues today with The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, more commonly known as All Souls' Day.

On this day we remember those of our own family and friends who have died, especially those who have died in the past year and whose memory is particularly vivid at this time. We also give expression to our confidence in the love of God to whom we have entrusted our loved ones.

The names of the departed will be remembered during this service.

If you are yet to enter a name to be read out, please complete one of the cards and place it in the basket provided before the service begins. All names placed in this basket will be read aloud.

All the cards will be presented at the Altar at the Commemoration and, towards the end of the service, they will be taken to the Holy Sepulchre Chapel, where candles will be lit.

In this way, All Souls' Day helps us to hold together the sober reality of death which so many in contemporary society are reluctant to confront, and the confident proclamation of the Easter faith in Jesus Christ, crucified and risen.

The Requiem for this service will be sung to the setting by Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924)

THE PEACE

Stand

The Choir sings

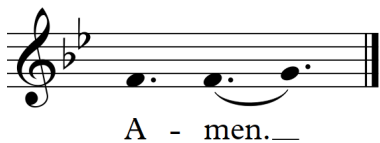
Christ has died: Christ is ris-en: Christ will come_ a- gain.

The President breaks the consecrated bread

THE GIVING AND RECEIVING OF COMMUNION

During Communion, the Choir sings

Deliver me, O Lord, from eternal death, on that fearful day when heaven and earth are shaken and you will come with fire to judge the earth. Trembling and fear shall seize me at the advent of your judgement and wrath. On that day of wrath, destruction and misery, that great and awful day, O Lord grant them eternal rest, and let light perpetual shine upon them.

and lead you into the holy city of Jerusalem.

who was once a beggar, into eternal rest.
Lord God, creator of all,
You have made us creatures of this earth,
but have also promised us a share in life eternal.
According to your promises,
may all who have died in the peace of Christ
come with your saints to the joys of your kingdom,
where there will be neither sorrow nor pain,
but life everlasting. **Alleluia. Amen.**

THE BLESSING

Stand

The God of peace,
who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus,
that great shepherd of the sheep,
make you perfect in every good work to do his will;
