Anglo-Saxon workshop	60 minutes	*NEW FOR 2022 / 2023*	
Pupils begin by learning about the Battle of Edington. They go on to design their own shields to create a class shield wall (which you can photograph to remind them of their visit to us). At the end of the workshop, they find out the outcome of the Battle of Edington and the signing of the Peace Treaty of Wedmore.			
Queen Emma workshop	60 minutes	*Great for your Anglo Saxon topic*	
The pupils are shown a picture of Queen Emma and King Canute. In teams, they have to work together to memorise what they have seen in the picture and recreate it with their team.			
Volsunga Saga story workshop	60 minutes	*Great for your Anglo Saxon topic*	
The pupils will be shown a photo of the Sigmund Stone cut up into pieces which they have to put back together (like an archaeologist). They are then told the story of Sigmund and the wolf from the Volsunga Saga.			
Archaeology workshop	60 minutes	*Great for your Anglo Saxon topic*	
Using items hidden in trays of sand, the pupils act as archaeologists to find the items, draw them (as an archaeologist would record them) and decide what they may have been used for.			
The life of a Medieval Monk	60 minutes		
Dressed as a monk, the pupils take on roles that the monks would have had and spend time in role.			
Prayer stations	60 minutes		
Using various themed spaces and resources for aid, pupils take time to reflect on topics such as conflict and personal growth.			
St Swithun	60 minutes		
Pupils are told two of the miracle stories of St Swithun and then can create either a pilgrims badge or complete a story worksheet.			
Winchester Bible / illumination	60 minutes		
Using the Winchester Bible as inspiration, pupils learn how books were made in the past and create their own illuminated letter.			
The Great West Window	60 minutes	*Great as an art workshop*	
The pupils create their own Great West Window using tissue paper, tracing paper and a frame. They are then told the story of the window and how it came to look as it does following events during the English Civil War.			
Medieval Medicine	60 minutes		
Pupils learn about the development of medical science and our understanding of the body from the Ancient Greeks to the modern day. Pupils then become trainee surgeons and diagnose their patients by looking at fake pee and create cures using herbs.			
Gargoyles	60 minutes	*Great as an art workshop*	
	vles and grotesques, pupils are split into ee, pupils are given air drying clay and sho ting their own.		

Medieval tile prints / Press Prints	60 minutes	*Great as an art workshop*	
Using the medieval tiles as inspiration, pupils create their own prints using paints			
Winchester through the Ages	60 minutes	*Great for a local area study*	
The pupils learn all about the changes in Winchester through different periods of history. The second part of the workshop is where they work as archaeologists to find 'treasures' in the sand trays, establish what they are and accurately draw them.			
Green Man	60 minutes	*Great as an art workshop*	
Using the green men in the cathedral as inspiration, pupils are told what a green man is and then using paper plates and mixed media, create their own green man face to take home.			
Q&A with the a Cathedral Canon	60 minutes		
Pupils are given time ask a member of clergy questions about life and faith. This is done via anonymous notes to begin with, with the opportunity to have discussions.			
WW1 and WW2	60 minutes		
This workshops focuses on remembrance. We can bespoke this workshop depending on the age of the pupils.			
Baptism	60 minutes		
Pupils write their own prayers which could be said at a baptism. Pupils then get to read out their prayers while standing around the cathedral font.			
What is it like to live in Winchester?	60 minutes	*Great for a local area study*	
We recruit volunteers from the Cathedral to speak to the pupils about what it is like to live in Winchester. They spend around 10 minutes listening to each adult and get the chance to ask them questions before moving onto the next adult.			
Learning about the High Street	60 minutes	*Great for a local area study*	
The pupils are led on a tour of the High Street and are able to categorise all of the shops e.g. clothing shop, cosmetic shop. At the top of the High Street, the pupils undertake a traffic survey.			
Learning about the Eucharist	60 minutes	*Great for GCSE groups*	
Pupils learn about the sacrament of the Eucharist with a member of the Cathedral clergy. They are taken through the service of the Eucharist with the traditions of the various elements explained and demonstrated.			
Sacred Geometry workshop	60 minutes		
Pupils work as a group to solve the problem of how to draw a trefoil with rudimentary equipment.			
William Walker	60 minutes		
Pupils are told the story of William Walker. They then go into role as William Walker and write a postcard to his family telling them of adventures.			
City Walk	60 minutes	*Great for a local area study*	
Led by a volunteer from the Learning Team, pupils go on a walking tour of Winchester learning all about the history of the city.
