



As 2024 begins, we would like to thank you for your ongoing support of the Friends. We hope you enjoyed taking part in some of our many hybrid talks last year, our monthly coffee mornings and our AGM. Our events this year cover a variety of topics including an interview with The Right Reverend Philip Mounstephen, Bishop of Winchester, about a range of Cathedral and diocesan topics, a talk in April by the Cathedral architect, Charlotte Robinson, and a cheese tasting event in June

We are delighted that the Friends so enthusiastically supported our organ fundraising. To celebrate the end of this project, there will be an organ concert in the Cathedral, by the world-renowned organist, Olivier Latry, on Saturday 27 April. In May, the Girls' Choir will celebrate its 25th anniversary and you are invited to attend a special Evensong on Sunday 5 May. The Southern Cathedrals Festival will be held in Winchester this July and there will be a series of special organ recitals during the summer and autumn months.

The Friends continue to fund girl and boy choristers, the Cathedral flower arrangers and the work of the gardeners. Also funded by the Friends is the Christmas tree in the west end of the Cathedral. We have recently supported the purchase of a new 'cherry-picker' which will be used for many tasks around the Cathedral now and in the years to come.

In June 2023, Canon Gary spent three weeks walking some of the Camino de Santiago in northern Spain. He will reflect on that experience, share some photographs and reflect on 'The Camino of Daily Life', and the Cathedral as a centre for receiving and sending Pilgrims.



CHARLOTTE ROBINSON, CATHEDRAL ARCHITECT "THE CATHEDRAL MASTERPLAN"

Wednesday 17 April, 7pm in the Paul Woodhouse Suite & 7.30pm on Zoom

The Cathedral Architect, Charlotte Robinson, will be presenting an overview of current projects including conservation works to the Tournai marble font, masonry and stained glass conservation to the south nave aisle windows, and refurbishment works at Cheyney Court, amongst others. Looking ahead, Charlotte will discuss the opportunities and challenges of looking after the Cathedral building and estate and give an update on the plans for a new estate masterplan and her first Quinquennial Inspection at Winchester.





ANNA WITHERS, WINCHESTER CATHEDRAL GUIDE "MEDIEVAL MONASTIC GARDENS"
