# THE GATHERING

## THE PROCESSIONAL HYMN

Stand to sing the processional hymn

THE WELCOME

The President greets the people

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you **and also with you**.

#### THE PRAYER OF PREPARATION

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

### THE PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

These or other suitable words are used as an invitation to confession

The sacrifice of God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart God will not despise. Let us come to the Lord, who is full of compassion, and acknowledge our transgressions in penitence and faith.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

#### THE ABSOLUTION

THE PSALM

An appointed psalm may be sung

### THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Stand. The Choir sings



The congregation repeat the refrain

The Choir sing one of these, or an alternative scriptural sentence

Lent

The Lord is a great God:

O that today you would listen to his voice,

harden not your hearts.

Passiontide

Christ humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and given him the name that is above every name.

All respond by singing the refrain, as printed above

### THE GOSPEL

Remain standing and face the Deacon

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*. Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ**.

#### THE SERMON

#### A sermon may be preached

Sit after the preacher's introductory prayer

#### THE NICENE CREED

#### Stand

We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

#### THE INTERCESSIONS

In the power of the Spirit and in union with Christ, let us pray to the Father.

Kneel or sit. This or an alternative response may be used

Lord, in your mercy hear our prayer.

At the end

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

## THE OFFERTORY HYMN


Remain standing to sing the offertory hymn during which the gifts of the people are presented and the altar is prepared, with bread and wine placed upon it, and a collection is taken for the mission and ministry of the Cathedral.


The President prays the Eucharistic Prayer, praising God for His mighty acts, followed by the Sanctus [and Benedictus] in one of these, or an alternative form

Sanctus, sanctus, sanctus, Dominus Deus Sabaoth, pleni sunt coeli et terra gloria tua. Hosanna in excelsis.

[Benedictus qui venit in nomine Domini. Hosanna in excelsis.] Holy, holy, holy, Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.


[Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.] The President prays the remainder of the Eucharistic Prayer recalling the Last Supper, then this acclamation or another may be used

### THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

#### The President breaks the consecrated bread

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

#### THE GIVING AND RECEIVING OF COMMUNION

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Communicant members of all Christian Churches are welcome to receive the Sacrament at this service. Those who wish to receive a blessing are invited to bow their head. Gluten-free communion wafers are available from the priest at the front

#### AGNUS DEI

The Agnus Dei is sung in one of these, or an alternative form

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, miserere nobis. Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us.

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, miserere nobis. Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us.

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccata mundi, dona nobis pacem. Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, grant us peace. A communion motet may be sung

#### THE PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Kneel or sit

The President may pray a post-communion prayer, and then

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

THE FINAL HYMN

Stand to sing the final hymn

Remain standing. These or other words of blessing are used

#### Lent

Christ give you grace to grow in holiness, to deny yourselves, take up your cross, and follow him; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.** 

### Passiontide

Christ crucified draw you to himself, to find in him a sure ground for faith, a firm support for hope, and the assurance of sins forgiven; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.** 

THE DISMISSAL

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. In the name of Christ. Amen.
